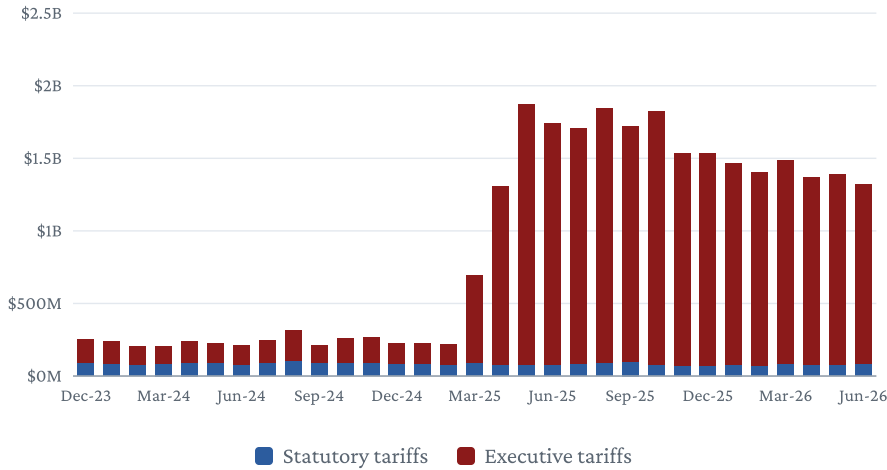

Estimated Tariffs on Imports into Michigan

Key Michigan Imports Facing Executive Tariffs

Steel, aluminum & other metals	\$1.5B	35.3%	20× the 2024 rate of 1.7%
Machinery & parts	\$681M	16.6%	13× the 2024 rate of 1.3%

Methodology. Figures are estimates of tariffs paid on imports into Michigan, split between statutory tariffs and executive tariffs imposed by presidential action, of which \$23 billion has been imposed since January 2025.
